Submarine History

The world's first submarine to be used in combat was the American Turtle, built in 1775 by American David Bushnell. The intended purpose of The Turtle was to attach explosives to the hulls of British warships while they were moored in harbor. The Turtle was maneuvered and powered entirely by hand cranks and foot pedals, designed and manufactured by Isaac Doolittle, a clock maker and silversmith. Sgt Ezra Lee was the pilot of The Turtle, and despite his intrepid perseverance, two attack missions on British ships were unsuccessful. Although The Turtle was not successful in sinking a ship, Bushnell is credited as having revolutionized the idea of attacking naval vessels from below. His ingenious submarine was truly an American Original.

JATO - Jet Assisted Takeoff

A USAF B-47 fully loaded with ordnance was so heavy that it could not get off the ground on a normal-length runway using the jet engines available at the time. To assist the heavy jet in getting airborne, solid fuel rockets were mounted to the fuselage and jettisoned soon after takeoff. JATO also known as RATO (Rocket Assist Takeoff) has been used on many heavy military and civilian jets, with the Strategic Air Command B-47 Stratojet being one of the most prominent and spectacular.


