## K-9 Veteran's Day

March 13 is K-9 Veterans Day to celebrate the sacrifices of generations of dogs who have served in the United States militaries.

The day of observance dates to 1942 when dogs were first recognized as enlisted personnel in the armed forces, although dogs have served in the militaries of many countries going back to the beginning of organized warfare. Because of their obedience, intelligence and keen senses of smell and hearing, large dogs are the ideal animal to use for reconnaissance. protection, guard duty, explosives detection and many other important aspects of ground tactics and combat.

Although dogs serve in all branches of the US military, the Air Force is responsible for training them at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas and then then escorting them to stations all over the world.

Puppies are raised in civilian foster homes until they are eight weeks old, at which time they enter basic training at Lackland. About half of the dogs wash out before completing their training, due to physical and mental issues.

In order to insure that the dogs are treated kindly by their handlers, a military dog is always one rank higher than its handler. Dogs can reach the rank of NCO in order to prevent a handler from outranking his or her dog.

The most decorated K-9 in WW2 was a German Shepherd-Collie-Husky named Chips, and during the invasion of Sicily, he broke away from his handler and bounded into an Italian machine gun nest, causing all four soldiers to drop their weapons and run, to be captured later by US soldiers. Chips attacked the enemy soldiers so ferociously that he escaped the incident with only a small bayonet wound to his scalp and minor gunpowder burns.
