
If you have not paid your 2023 dues, please do. You will need to have your dues paid up by the end of the year in order to gat a new key card starting January 1, 2023.


fun.

United States Marine Corps

The United States Marine Corps was founded in Philadelphia on November 10, 1775, during the American Revolution. It was then known as the Continental Marines and originally consisted of two infantry battalions of men who were particularly capable of fighting both on land and at sea. During the Revolution, Continental Marines conducted numerous amphibious landings and raids upon British strongholds along the Atlantic coast and in the Caribbean. Marine sharpshooters were also stationed aboard warships, where during naval engagements they fired upon enemy personnel from high in the ship's rigging.

It has often been said that during WWI, the Americans arrived in Europe just in time to prevent an Allied loss. In 1918, the 5th and 6th Marine Regiments launched a counterattack against the German army at Belleau Wood in France. As they organized their attack position, they encountered French troops who were in retreat from the Germans after being overwhelmed in the battle. The French troops yelled at the U.S. Marines to retreat as well. but Marine Captain Lloyd Williams, demonstrating the intrepid spirit of the Marine Corps, is said to have yelled back, "Retreat? Hell, we just got here!" The Marines went on to defeat the German troops after a fierce battle in the woods that lasted for three weeks. and the Allies were on their way to eventual victory.

The Marines' unique ability to engage the enemy on both land and sea was instrumental in the success of the amphibious warfare of WWII in Europe, North Africa, and the Pacific. In the later stages of the war, U. S. Marines played a most imperative role in capturing and securing many of the Pacific islands occupied by Japanese troops, including (among numerous others) Guadalcanal, Iwo Jima, Saipan, and Okinawa. Mainland Japan would likely have been invaded as well, had the Japanese not surrendered to the United States in 1945.

Several years later, U.S. Marines made numerous amphibious landings in Korea and fought along with U.S. Army troops on the ground throughout the Korean War. In addition, fighter pilots from the 1st Marine Aircraft Wing flew more than 118,000 attack missions over North Korea.

Almost half a million Marines served during the Vietnam War, where they carried out large-scale search and destroy operations against the Viet Cong, while also providing air support with both helicopters and jet aircraft which attacked enemy targets throughout the war in both North and South Vietnam. The Marines were instrumental in repelling the North Vietnamese Tet Offensive in 1968, including a decisive victory after an intense and costly 26-day battle at Hue City. U.S. Marines accounted for nearly a third of the U.S. casualties during the Vietnam War.

From Marines.com - "Our Purpose: Marines are trained to improvise, adapt, and overcome any obstacle in whatever situation they are needed. They have the willingness to engage and the determination to defeat the enemy until victory is seized."

Fun Fact

Although Colonel Sanders served in the U.S. Army for several months before being honorably discharged, he was not an officer. The honorary title of "Kentucky Colonel" was later bestowed upon him in 1950 by his friend Lawrence Wetherby, Governor of Kentucky.
